# Rules, Regulations & Conditions of Entry

- 1 Classes in this Schedule are open to individual exhibitors, resident in any district, except where specified in the schedule. All entries to be exhibitor's own work; craft items must not have been previously exhibited in this show. **Joint entries will not be allowed.**
- 2 Exhibits must be staged between 7.00am and 10.00am on the day of the show, and all competitors must vacate the show areas by 10.00am when judging will commence. Exhibits must be left until 4.00pm when they should be collected. Any items not collected before 4.15pm will be auctioned, starting at approximately 4.15pm unless clearly marked "NOT FOR SALE".
- 3 No responsibility can be accepted for any loss that may occur. Committee members will supervise the removal of exhibits prior to the auction, after which the show areas may be unattended. Any complaint should be raised before 3.30pm on the day of the show to a committee member.
- 4 **No exhibit may carry any name or mark of identity and all food-stuffs must be covered.**
- 5 Vases for Horticultural flower classes will be supplied **and these must be used.** Exhibitors must provide their own dishes and bowls.
- 6 Each exhibitor shall pay a fee for each entry in any class up to ten entries; further entries are free. Exhibitors are asked to make any cheques in payment of entry fees to HH & CGS.
- 7 Any person exhibiting produce not of their own growing, or which has not been in their possession two months previous to the show, will forfeit all prizes and shall not be allowed to compete in future shows.
- 8 A judge may not enter a class that he/she is judging.
- 9 Only one entry per class per exhibitor.
- 10 The closing date for entries is the Thursday prior to the show (19th August 2010). If insufficient entries are received by the closing date, classes may be cancelled at the organisers' discretion.
- 11 **All competitors will be charged for admission to the show. (£2 adults, £1 OAPs & children).**
- 12 All awards will be handed out between 3.00pm and 3.30pm on the day of the show, at the show-ground.

# HORTICULTURAL CLASSES

## FLOWERS

- 1 Vase of flowers - 1 kind, mixed colours allowed
- 2 2 vases of flowers - distinct kind in each vase, mixed colours allowed
- 3 Vase of mixed flowers - arranged for effect
- 4 Roses - 1 bloom
- 5 Roses - 1 bowl, six blooms of not less than three varieties - own foliage only
- 6 Roses - Floribunda or Clustered - 1 vase of 2 stems
- 7 Roses - Cycle of Bloom, 1 bud in colour, 1 bloom and 1 full blown flower, all of the same variety
- 8 1 Specimen Bloom, excluding roses
- 9 1 Specimen Spike, e.g. Gladiolus, Delphinium etc.
- 10 Gladioli - 1 vase of 3 spikes
- 11 Any other Annual - 5 blooms raised from seed during 12 months preceding the show, mixed types & colours.
- 12 Dahlias - 1 vase of 3 Decorative blooms, mixed colours allowed
- 13 Dahlias - 1 vase of 3 Cactus or Semi-cactus blooms, mixed colours allowed
- 14 Dahlias - 1 vase of 5 Ball blooms, mixed colours allowed
- 15 Dahlias - 1 vase of 5 blooms any other type, e.g.: orchid, water lily, or pom-pom, mixed types and colours allowed

## **Recipe for Class 88 - Death by Chocolate Cake**

*500g plain chocolate, 200g butter, 1 tsp espresso powder, 5 eggs separated, 75g plain flour, 2 tbsp cocoa powder, 1 tsp baking powder, 50g ground almond, 150g caster sugar, 30g light soft brown sugar, 200ml double cream.*

Preheat oven to 160 deg C / Gas mark 3. Grease and base-line two 20cm cake tins. Melt 200g chocolate with butter. Stir in espresso dissolved in 2 tbsp of boiling water. Beat egg yolks with sugar, then add to chocolate mixture. Fold in sifted flour, cocoa, baking powder, and ground almonds, followed by stiffly beaten egg white. Bake 20-30 minutes until well risen and springy to touch. Icing - heat cream, add 250g chocolate, melt and cool. Use to fill cake and ice top and side, then decorate with 50g chocolate.

## Rules, Regulations continued

- 13 Points awarded shall be 4, 3 & 2 for all classes except those in **Bold Type**, which receive 6, 4 & 3. Additional prizes, if awarded, will carry proportionate points and, in the event of a tie, most firsts will decide.
- 14 Hurst Horticultural Society is affiliated to the Royal Horticultural Society and the exhibits will be judged under RHS rules, unless otherwise stated in the schedule.
- 15 This Society shall be called HURST HORTICULTURAL & COTTAGE GARDEN SOCIETY and shall have for its object the promotion of Horticulture.
- 16 The Society shall be conducted by a President, Treasurer, Secretary and a Committee of not less than 14, with power to add to their number, 5 to form a quorum. The President, Treasurer and Secretary to be ex-officio members of the Committee. All of the Committee shall retire each year, but shall be eligible for re-election at the AGM.
